3. <u>General Description of Services</u>: The Tucson Airport Authority ("TAA") invites interested engineering firms to submit a Statement of Qualifications ("SOQ") in response to the Request for Qualifications ("RFQ") for Professional Services required for 10119102 Airfield Safety Enhancement (ASE) Program, which includes, without limitation, airfield design, pavement, geometric, drainage, grading, electrical, NAVAID, pavement marking, geotechnical investigation, cost estimating, and limited construction administration.

4. <u>General Description of Project</u>: The ASE Program includes safety and standards improvement to the Tucson International Airport (TUS) airfield. The program is anticipated to be broken into four separate projects, each with its own separate design team. TAA's intent is to select up to four design teams, one for each of the projects via this RFQ. The design team will provide design services for a Construction Manager At Risk (CMAR) project and three teams will provide design services for Design-Bid-Build (DBB) projects. Project design is anticipated to be funded by grants from the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) and the Arizona Department of Transportation (ADOT). TAA anticipates that it will award four multi-year (five-year) Design Professional services contracts for the project Projects are as follows:

- <u>CMAR</u>: Demolish Existing Runway 11R/29L (approx. 8,408' X 75') and associated taxiways; Construct Full Length Parallel Runway – (approx. 10,996' X 150'); Construct New Full-Length Centerline Parallel Taxiway – (approx. 11,200' X 75'); Construct New Outboard Parallel Taxiway – (approx. 8,000' X 75'); Construct Supporting Connector Taxiways between Runway 11R/29L and both Outboard and Centerline Parallel Taxiway; Associated Drainage Improvements; and Install three new Arizona Air National Guard Arresting Systems on the New Parallel Runway (non AIP)
- <u>DBB1</u>: Construct Bypass Taxiways (approx. 1,600' X 75' A1) and (approx. 1,100' X 75' F); Construct Supporting Connector Taxiways; Removal of existing concrete apron and demolition of four existing buildings/hangars within the surrounding areas; Associated Drainage Improvements; Construct Arizona Air National Guard (AANG) Extended Arm/Disarm Pad; and Install one new Arizona Air National Guard Arresting Systems on Runway 3/21 (non AIP)
- <u>DBB2</u>: Demolition of 12 USAF Earth Covered Magazines (ECM's) adjacent to AFP 44; Relocation of the USAF Plant 44 Fencing (approx. 7,200 lf); and Associated Drainage Improvements
- <u>DBB3</u>: Displace runway 11L Arrivals Threshold including Glideslope and MALSR Relocation; Construct Supporting Connector Taxiways; Close Taxiway A2 segments between Taxiway A and Runway 3/21 and the Taxiway A2 segments between Runway 3/21 and Taxiway D; Associated Drainage Improvements; and Remove and Replace Two Existing Arizona AANG Arresting System and construction of a new overrun barrier on Runway 11L (non AIP)

The RFQ contains the instructions, terms and conditions, forms, and other information relating to the RFQ, including, but not limited to, the number of persons or firms to be included on the final list, the selection criteria to be used by the selection committee to select the person or firm to perform the services, the relative weight of the selection criteria, information regarding interviews, and the number of contracts to be awarded.

7. <u>Date and Time for Submission of SOQ</u>: Written SOQs will be received by TAA until 2:00 p.m. Local Tucson Time on Thursday, May 16, 2019, attention Kathy Myers, Procurement Manager at the TAA Administration Offices, Tucson International Airport, Third Floor, 7250 South Tucson Boulevard, Suite 300, Tucson, Arizona 85756. One (1) original and five (5) copies of the SOQ shall be required to be addressed and delivered to TAA on or before the day and hour set for receipt. An SOQ may be withdrawn by written request any time before the scheduled time and date for receipt. Any SOQ submitted after the designated date and time will not be accepted or considered.

8. <u>Pre-Submission Conference</u>: A pre-submission conference for the project will be held on Thursday, April 25, 2019, at 1:30 p.m. at the TAA Board Room, Tucson International Airport, Second Floor (Ticketing Level), 7250 South Tucson Boulevard, Tucson, Arizona 85756. At this conference, TAA staff will discuss the scope of services, the proposed date for interviews, the selection process, and respond to questions about the RFQ. The pre-submission conference will also include an opportunity to visit the sites of the proposed services.

9. <u>No Prices or Pricing Information</u>: SOQs submitted by any interested persons or firms shall **NOT** include prices or any pricing information for the proposed services.

10. <u>Costs of Responding to the RFQ</u>: Any and all costs associated with responding to this RFQ or providing an SOQ shall be borne solely by the interested person or firm.

11. <u>TAA's Right to Reject for Any Reason</u>: TAA reserves the right to reject any or all SOQs, any other proposals or submissions, to cancel the RFQ, or to withhold the award of any contract relating to the RFQ for any reason which TAA determines.

12. <u>Interest List</u>: TAA maintains an interest list consisting of all design professionals, contractors, subconsultants / subcontractors, and major suppliers who are interested in receiving notification of airport projects. Each firm must complete and submit, with its submittal, information with respect to each firm in the form included in the solicitation documents.

13. <u>Civil Rights Title VI Solicitation Notice</u>. The Tucson Airport Authority, in accordance with the provisions of Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 (78 Stat. 252, 42 U.S.C. §2000d to 2000d-4) and the Regulations, hereby notifies all bidders that it will affirmatively ensure that any contract entered into pursuant to this advertisement, disadvantaged business enterprises will be afforded full and fair opportunity to submit bids in response to this invitation and will not be discriminated against on the grounds of race, color, or national origin in consideration for an award.

14. <u>DBE</u>: It is the policy of the Department of Transportation ("DOT") and TAA that Disadvantaged Business Enterprise firms ("DBEs") as defined in 49 CFR Part 26 (the "DBE Regulations"), shall have a fair and equal opportunity to participate in the performance of contracts financed in whole or in part with federal funds. TAA, in compliance with 49 CFR § 26, has adopted a program regarding the participation of DBEs on federally funded projects. TAA has set an aspirational 7% (7% of the dollar value of the contract) DBE participation goal for this contract. Specifically, it is the goal of TAA to ensure that, to the extent reasonably possible and consistent with other legal requirements that: (a) DBEs are not discriminated against in the award and administration of TAA's contracts; (b) a level playing field is created on which DBEs can compete fairly for TAA's contracts; and (c) any barriers to the participation of DBEs in TAA's contracts are removed. A copy of this program is available upon request. The consultant has responsibility in monitoring compliance to the referenced statute or regulation.

15. <u>Legal Requirements</u>: The services to be performed will be subject to the provisions of Title 34 of the Arizona Revised Statutes (A.R.S. § 34-101, *et seq.*, as amended). All persons or firms submitting an SOQ and their subconsultants must be duly licensed to perform the work at the time the SOQ is submitted (or exempt from licensing requirements) pursuant to all applicable laws, rules, and regulations. If a licensing exemption is claimed, the person or firm must set forth the basis for the claimed exemption in writing at the time the SOQ is submitted. In addition, the proposed project will be paid for in part with monies to be received from ADOT. For grant funded projects, additional terms and conditions may apply as set forth in the RFQ and proposed Contract Documents.

15.1 <u>Federal Requirements</u>. Any person or firm submitting an SOQ in response to the RFQ must certify compliance with the trade restriction requirements set forth in 49 CFR Part 30, and will be required to comply with the requirements in any resulting contract. Any person or firm submitting an SOQ in response to the RFQ must certify compliance with the prohibitions found in Appendix A of 49 CFR Part 20.

The successful Respondent to this RFQ will be required to assist TAA to ensure compliance with multiple federal requirements, including but not limited to those found in Section 6002 of the Solid Waste Disposal Act, as amended, and the regulatory provisions of 40 CFR Part 247.
